This letter is to inform you of courses needed for graduation that your son/daughter has failed the second semester of this school year. These courses can be taken either in summer school or possibly high school plus.

Summer school registration materials are available on the MCPS website (www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org). The registration deadline for the second summer session is July 9th.

Academic course work for the next school year will be adjusted once summer school grades are forwarded to the Blake Counseling Department. Please be advised that students must earn the minimum number of required credits in the four HSA-related content areas (English, Algebra, Government and Biology.) This promotion process will be automated to ensure that all students earn the specific course credits required for graduation. **For example, in order to become a senior, a student must earn a minimum of 15 course credits, including at least three credits for required mathematics courses, three credits for required English courses, two credits for required science courses, and two credits for required social studies students.** This sequence ensures that students will have successfully completed the four HSA courses prior to their senior year. Please see the chart on the flip side of this page from Mr. Frank Stetson, Chief School Performance Officer & Erick Lang, Associate Superintendent for Curriculum and Instructional Programs for further clarification.

As you know, all students must earn 22 credits in specific content areas and meet the Maryland High School Assessment (HSA) graduation requirements to achieve a Maryland diploma. In order to earn the required credits and graduate in four years, students should complete the four HSA courses prior to their senior year.

Starting with this school year, 2009–2010, students must earn the minimum number of credits as indicated on the chart below to be promoted to the next grade level. This includes all of the four HSA areas (English, Algebra, Government, and Biology). For example, in order to become an 11th grader, a student must earn a minimum of 10 course credits, including at least two credits for required mathematics courses, two credits for required English courses, one credit for required science course, and one credit for required social studies course. This sequence ensures that students will have successfully completed the four HSA courses prior to their senior year. Students who successfully complete HSA courses prior to their senior year have time to retake tests and/or complete Bridge Projects, if necessary to graduate on time.

Therefore, the principal, in consultation with the counselor and parents/guardians, may change a grade level placement when unusual circumstances occur. 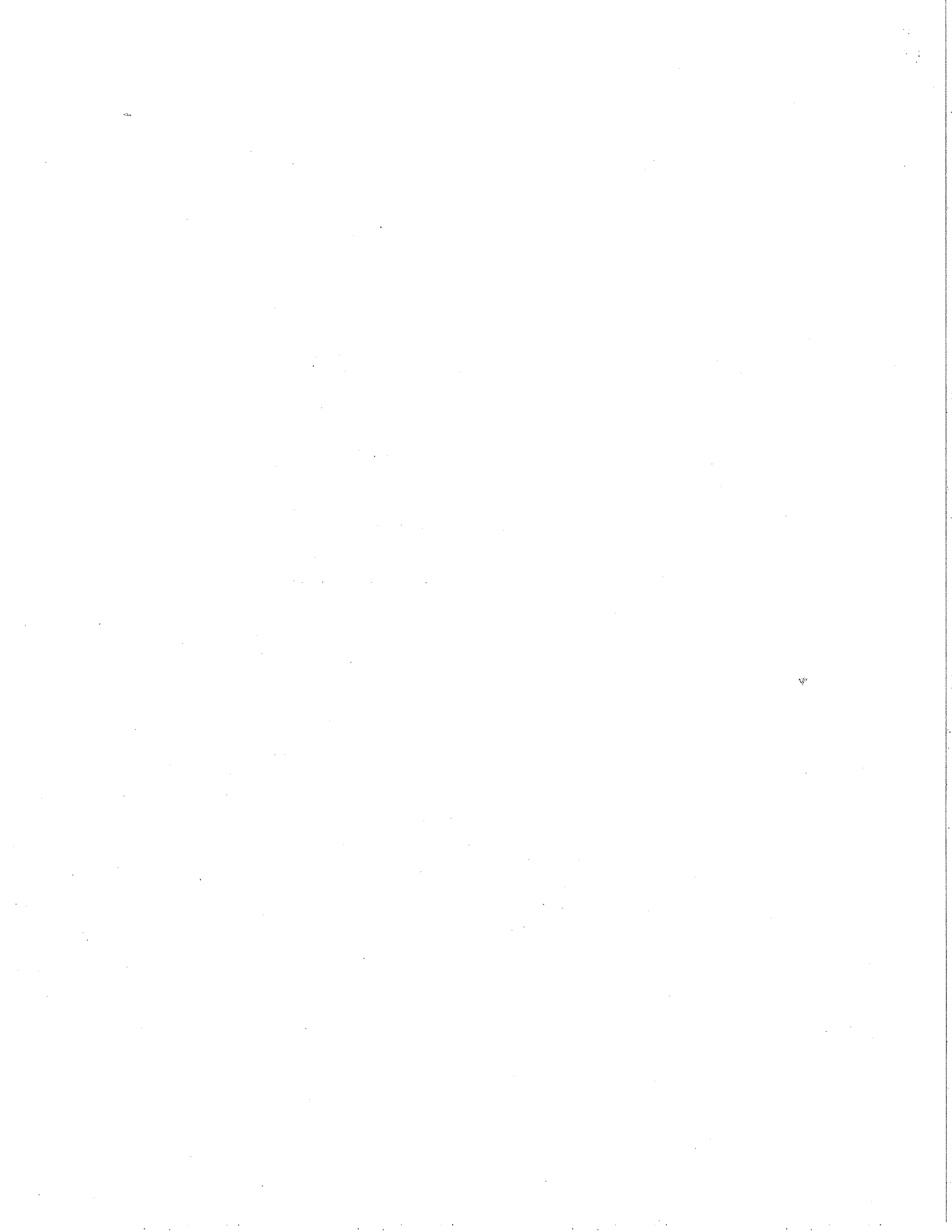
